Lighthouses of Prince Edward Island

Prince Edward Island is dotted with 50 lighthouses and this tour will give you a chance to visit two! The Woods Island lighthouse was completed in 1876 and consists of a 52-foot, square pyramidal wood tower with lantern and gallery, rising from one end of a 1½ -story wood keeper's house. The building is painted white with red trim and the lantern and keeper's house roof are red. The keeper's house is used as a crafts shop and visitor center, so a stop here is sure to give you a chance to capture wonderful photographs and shop for souvenirs. During your visit, enjoy a cup of tea or coffee accompanied by a local, sweet treat!

Next, travel to the Prim Point Lighthouse, set against a wild, windswept landscape. Built in 1845, it is the first and oldest lighthouse on Prince Edward Island, and one of only two round brick lighthouses in Canada. Standing just over 60 feet tall from foundation to weathervane, it consists of five levels all of which are connected by a series of wooden steps. For those who wish, you may step inside, climb to the top and be rewarded with wonderful views.

As we depart, sit back and relax on the return drive to the pier as your guide shares local highlights.
